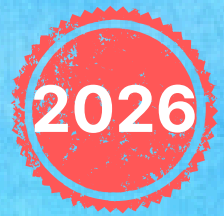

"Sowers in action – for a good life!"

This summer, **"Sower"** is our symbol of creation and holistic development – **for a good life.**

But what do we need to have a good life?

Our Sower does not only sow seeds for food, but also seeds of values for a good life, for himself and for others.

Our activities have been organized into three age groups:

***"Young Sowers on Discoveries!",
"Sowers and Caretakers", and
"Sowers, Inspirers and Creators".***

There are two weekly projects for each age group, as explained below:

pre-kindergarten & kindergarten

The **Young Sowers** come into daily, hands-on contact with the animals and plants of the farm and with the richness of nature.

Through exploration and observation, sensory experiences, and play, they experiment, discover the cycle of the seasons and the origins of basic foods, and learn to connect with the environment and with each other.

Our groups put forward their environmental and emotional messages into the world every day through the "tree of communication."

Grades 1, 2, 3 & 4

The **Sowers and Caretakers** cultivate care as a way of life.

They learn to take on small responsibilities and to nurture cooperation through shared activities and hands-on involvement in the farm and the group's daily tasks.

They connect caring for the land and the animals with caring for themselves and the group, creating collective experiences.

They also proudly post their messages of care and collaboration every day on the "tree of communication"!

Grades 5, 6, & 7, 8

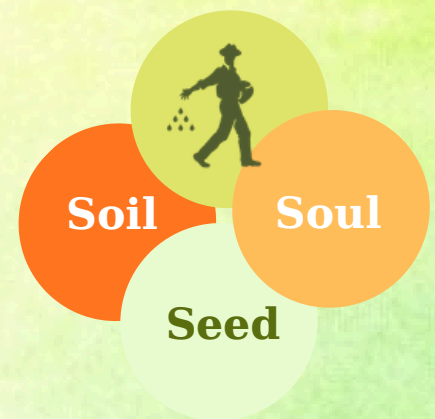
The **Sowers, Inspirers, and Creators** deepen their relationship with society and the world around them.

Explorations on the farm, caring for crops in our vegetable gardens and orchards, getting to know our animals, kneading dough, cooking, and creating something new with our own products, scientific investigations and entrepreneurial proposals on current sustainability issues and on what it means **to live well**—all of these are harmoniously complemented by theatrical techniques, emotional-expression games, storytelling and dramatization of myths, visual arts creations, clay workshops, and movement-based games.

Our Sowers learn how to sow and cultivate what they need in order to live well with themselves, with others, and with the environment.
